GUILFORD COMMUNITY

Guilford was planned by the Olmsted firm and developed by the Roland Park Company in the early 1900's. It has stunningly beautiful architecture, community parks, streets lined with mature trees, the world-famous Sherwood Gardens, and a prime location that is a short commute to downtown Baltimore. Guilford is designated a National Register Historic District.





Incidents of Crime November 2022 – October 2023


- 57 incidents within Guilford

GSP Contributions

- 53% of property owners contribute to the Guilford Security Patrol (GSP)
- Similar participation numbers in 2023 vs. 2022
- Contributions fund approximately
 75 hours of coverage each week
- Additional \$49,000 budgeted for extra hours if needed or for other security expenditures

Traffic & Streets Committee

Kevin Creamer

- DPW watermain replacement work was completed in July on Kemble and Lambeth Roads.
- DOT shared at the 6/7/23 Association Board meeting that there is currently a 7-year waitlist for new sidewalk replacement requests, due to the prioritization of major safety and ADA non-compliant sidewalk repairs across the City

Sidewalk Repairs

The process for submitting a sidewalk repair request remains the same:

- Submit a 311 request
- Email the Association with your service request number so that we can add it to a tracking log
- Improperly repaired sidewalks
 (non-exposed aggregate) should
 be brought to the attention of the
 Association office manager
 (officemanager@guilfordasssociation.org)

As a reminder:

Any contractor contracted with either Baltimore City or BGE is required to adhere to the neighborhood sidewalk standards.

Asphalt patch work is intended as a temporary patch to areas under construction or repair. Notify the association if you see areas that have not been repaved after initial patchwork.

The City/BGE is financially responsible for sidewalk repairs only when it is caused by City project work or City trees. Nevertheless, going through the DOT repair process yields a discount on contracted work.

The committee is working with DOT and Councilwoman Ramos on strategies to address this wait time for new repair requests.

Greenway Traffic Triangle

- Funds were earmarked for the restoration of a traffic triangle at Greenway/Millbrook/Northway in the 2022-23 legislative session
- Architectural committee met with DOT to review site concepts and select configuration
- DOT-TEC received approval in August for engineering consultant tasks and are working on scoping/assigning this project for design
- Councilman Conway's Office assisting with moving through the process



City Street Trees

- Use 311 service to report dead city trees and stump removal. Provide Association office manager with service request number.
- Use the "Baltimore City Street Tree Request Form" for new trees
- Currently reviewing Guilford's tree inventory against the city's records and updating our maps for future requests.




Parks Committee



Architectural Committee

Tom Hobbs

No building, fence, wall or other structure shall be commenced, erected or maintained, nor shall any addition to or change or alteration therein be made, until the plans and specifications . . . shall have been submitted to and approved in writing by the Company . . .

Sub-Division VII, Guilford Deed and Agreement

Architectural Committee

- Year to Date: 101 formal applications received and reviewed
- Committee reviews and approves all proposed exterior changes for consistency with the Architectural Guidelines
- Requests for technical guidance
- Generally excellent compliance
- No major exterior projects undertaken many fences, exterior patios, window repairs or replacement, roof replacements or repairs.
- Hundreds of thousands of dollars invested on interior upgrades and improvements



- 48 properties have sold in 2023 with an average sales price of \$941,990 (\$898,202 without 15 Charlcote)
- 40 properties sold in 2022 with an average sales price of \$868,412
- All properties reviewed for covenant compliance



Maryland Tax Credits


- Guilford was designated as a National Register Historic District in 2001
- Allows Guilford property owners to receive MD Historic Tax Credits for improvements and maintenance tax credit equal to 20% of the costs.
- In the past decade the state has recognized more than \$2.7 million in eligible Guilford home improvements







Loyola University Parking Triangle



Loyola University Parking Triangle






York Rd/Greenmount Ave Committee

York Rd Business Improvement District

- Plans to establish a Business Improvement District (BID) were approved in February 2023
- Two mile stretch of York Road between Northern Parkway and 39th Street.
- The BID will implement an annual fee of \$0.22 per \$100 of the assessed property value of businesses
- The money raised by these fees will fund BID initiatives and help to drive commercial and retail traffic




Human Crematorium Update

- A group of community stakeholders, including the YRP, Radnor-Winston, and Winston-Govans Neighborhood associations have continued to oppose the construction of a crematory incinerator at 4905 York Road
- Previous efforts to oppose the placement of the crematorium have been struck down in court
- YRP has filed an brief in Appellate Court to continue their opposition efforts
- YRP is seeking volunteer lawyers to help support the filing of an amicus brief



- To be sold by the City
- Site subject to terms of Guilford Deed & Agreement
- Representatives from Guilford Association, DHCD, DGS-Midtown Academy & Mayor Scott's office met in Jan 2023
- Midtown Academy still pursuing purchase; completed walkthrough of facility in early Nov. and will report findings in early Dec.
- Continue to contact Kelly Maher and David Pontious (Councilman Conway's office) with questions or concerns.
